

# Key Volunteer Agreement 2016

Understanding the mission of Student Life to reach the world for Christ, as a Key Volunteer with the Power to Change Catalytic Ministry, I commit to pursue the following:

## A Heart for God

- by submitting to the Lordship of Christ in my daily life and ministry
- by spending consistent time in the Word and prayer in an ongoing relationship with Christ
- by attending a local church to receive insight and encouragement

## A Heart for Growth

- by communicating weekly or fortnightly with my Catalytic coach for direction and training
- by attending the three Power to Change Campus training conferences:
  - The Catalytic Kick-off Retreat (30 Jan – 3 Feb at Gold Coast)
  - The “Breakthrough/ConneXions” weekend camp (1-3 Apr in QLD, 8-10 Apr in NSW, 28-30 Mar in Vic)
  - National Mid-Year Conference (4-9 July in Sydney)

## A Heart for Multiplication

- by actively participating in and directing initiative evangelism weekly (this could be questionnaires, leading a CE, or engaging in spiritual conversations)
- by taking part in the Great Commission (Matt 28:18-20) and making disciples
- by attending a summer project with Power to Change (2 weeks in Nov/Dec)

## Available

- by being available to spend reasonable amounts time in ministry. I understand that the demands will be greater at certain times of the year (start of the semesters) and less at others (uni breaks).
- This time would be invested in these areas: prayer, evangelism, a small group meeting, discipleship, organisation and preparation.

## Counting the Cost - What will it take to make disciples? (Matt 28:18-20, 2 Tim 2:2)

- What needs to change in my walk with God?

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• What do I need to ask and trust God for?

- How much evangelism do I need to do?

- How much time do I want to invest each week?
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Additionally, I acknowledge that my relationship to Power to Change and the Catalytic Ministry is that of an uncompensated volunteer and not that of an employee, agent, or independent contractor. I will use my best efforts to fulfil my responsibilities in support of Power to Change’s philosophy, methodology and theology, which has, as its goal, reaching the world with the gospel of Jesus Christ. I understand that my activities will be supervised by a Power to Change missionary, who shall be designated as a Catalytic Coach. # POWER TO CHANGE - STATEMENT OF FAITH

The sole basis of our beliefs is the Bible, God's infallible written Word, the sixty-six books of the Old and New Testaments. We believe that it was uniquely, verbally and fully inspired by the Holy Spirit, and that it was written without error (inerrant) in the original manuscripts. It is the supreme and final authority in all matters on which it speaks.

We accept those areas of doctrinal teaching on which, historically, there has been general agreement among all true Christians. Because of the specialised calling of our movement, we desire to allow for freedom of conviction on other doctrinal matters, provided that any interpretation is based upon the Bible alone, and that no such interpretation shall become an issue which hinders the ministry to which God has called us.

We explicitly affirm our belief in basic Bible teachings, as follows:

1. There is one true God, eternally existing in three persons - Father, Son and Holy Spirit - each of whom possesses equally all the attributes of Deity and the characteristics of personality.
2. Jesus Christ is God, the living Word, who became flesh through His miraculous conception by the Holy Spirit and His virgin birth. Hence, He is perfect Deity and true humanity united in one person forever.
3. He lived a sinless life and voluntarily atoned for the sins of people by dying on the cross as their substitute, thus satisfying divine justice and accomplishing salvation for all who trust in Him alone.
4. He rose from the dead in the same body, though glorified, in which He lived and died.
5. He ascended bodily into heaven and sat down at the right hand of God the Father, where He, the only mediator between God and people, continually makes intercession for His own.
6. Humanity was originally created in the image of God. People sinned by disobeying God; thus, they were alienated from their Creator. That historic fall brought all humanity under divine condemnation.
7. Human nature is corrupted, and we are thus totally unable to please God. Every person is in need of regeneration and renewal by the Holy Spirit.
8. The salvation of humanity is wholly a work of God's free grace and is not the work, in whole or in part, of human works or goodness or religious ceremony. God imputes His righteousness to those who put their faith in Christ alone for their salvation, and thereby justifies them in His sight.
9. It is the privilege of all who are born again of the Spirit to be assured of their salvation from the very moment in which they trust Christ as their Saviour. This assurance is not based upon any kind of human merit, but is produced by the witness of the Holy Spirit, who confirms in the believer the testimony of God in His written Word.
10. The Holy Spirit has come into the world to reveal and glorify Christ and to apply the saving work of Christ to humanity. He convicts and draws sinners to Christ, imparts new life to them, continually indwells them from the moment of spiritual birth and seals them until the day of redemption. His fullness, power and control are appropriated in the believer's life by faith.
11. Every believer is called to live so in the power of the indwelling Spirit that they will not fulfil the lust of the flesh but will bear fruit to the glory of God.
12. Jesus Christ is the Head of the Church, His Body, which is composed of all people, living and dead, who have been joined to Him through saving faith.
13. God admonishes His people to assemble together regularly for worship, for participation in ordinances, for edification through the Scriptures and for mutual encouragement.
14. At physical death the believer enters immediately into eternal, conscious fellowship with the Lord and awaits the resurrection of their body to everlasting glory and blessing.
15. At physical death the unbeliever enters immediately into eternal, conscious separation from the Lord and awaits the resurrection of their body to everlasting judgement and condemnation.
16. Jesus will come again to the earth – personally, visibly and bodily – to consummate history and the eternal plan of God.
17. The Lord Jesus Christ commanded all believers to proclaim the gospel throughout the world and to disciple people of every nation. The fulfilment of that Great Commission requires that all worldly and personal ambitions be subordinated to a total commitment to "Him who loved us and gave Himself for us."

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Without mental reservation, I hereby subscribe to the above statements and pledge myself to help fulfil the Great Commission in our generation, depending upon the Holy Spirit to guide and empower me. \*
